Message from the Pastor:

St. Joseph Parish's involvement in the faith formation of our schools and its children has four key dimensions: sacramental preparation, school Masses, classroom visits and offering the sacraments.

We offer sacramental preparation for those who are receiving their First Holy Communion (Grade 2 students) and share the work with the schools in preparing the Grade 7 students to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Our primary role is to help foster an encounter with the Lord, and to teach the children the importance of recognizing God in their lives. School Masses are a great opportunity to do this, both through the beauty of the Liturgy and the real presence of our Lord in the Eucharist. By doing this, we introduce the children to communal prayer and lay the groundwork for them so that they can build their own strong relationship with God through personal prayer. We also want to have the young people experience the

Mass in their parish Church, and for this reason, we have requested that at least one of the four yearly school Masses take place at St. Joseph's parish.

The Parish's final and perhaps most important role is to make the sacraments readily available to the children. We do this by pointing out to them the days and times of our sacramental celebrations (Masses, Reconciliation, etc.). Hopefully, this will prepare them to take ownership of their spiritual lives and to live a sacramental life where they may truly grow and flourish. We look forward to collaborating with our schools in this endeavour throughout the year.

Recognizing Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations:

Framed by the Ontario Catholic School Graduate Expectations (OCSGE), our graduates will be effective communicators, reflective thinkers, lifelong learners, collaborative contributors, caring family members, responsible citizens and discerning believers formed in the Catholic faith community.

To celebrate OCSGE, we as a school community....

- OSCGE Medallion Program to create a better understanding amongst staff and students of the distinctive expectations for Catholic School Graduates, every month we will focus on a specific OSCGE. At the end of the month one child from each class will receive an OCSGE Medal. The program will be part of daily announcements, infused into virtue assemblies, included in the weekly Staff memo, posted in every classroom and pictures are put on OCSGE Wall.
- Embed the OCSGE into all the learning that takes place.
- Post visible signs of the OCSGE around the school and classrooms.
- Engage in school wide activities to further understand the OCSGE (morning announcements/medallion program/recognition wall)
- Celebrate mass/liturgy of the word and virtues as a school community
- Promote forgiveness, empathy, compassion, caring, and respect when conflicts arise
- Listen to the Word of God (Mass/Liturgies)
- Promote self-reflection in both students and staff
- Focus on respecting the thoughts and opinions of others
- Celebrate our gifts given to us by God
- Promote a sense of authentic stewardship (caring of our school, parish, community, and the world around us).

Celebrating Virtues:

A virtue is a habit or established capacity to perform good actions according to a moral standard. When we practice these virtues, we strengthen them and thereby make the presence of God more and more visible in the world around us.

The virtues of faith, respect, empathy, kindness, conscience, love, hope, acceptance, selfcontrol and fairness are always visible within our school. We draw upon the virtues to celebrate successes and as a tool during progressive discipline.

At St. Raymond, the virtues are present in all our actions as a school community. They are referenced daily, whether it is through prayer or a curriculum connection.

St. Raymond school masses and liturgies are two areas where our virtues come to life within our school community. We also provide opportunities for each class to prepare a virtue presentation on the onset of each month to set the tone of the virtue of the month.

Visible Signs of our Faith:

Through symbol and service, we are instruments of God's love whose work within our communities stands as a witness to our faith.

At. St. Raymond we have many visible signs of our faith in our classrooms, hallways and common areas.

These visible signs include:

- Display in front foyer (virtue focus)
- "Talk About It Sign" we change the sign out front with a new scripture reading every month.
- Alcoves displaying Saints and Bible
- All classes have Crosses and Bibles
- Prayer tables in all classrooms
- Visual displays around the school/Front Foyer wall painted with Virtues & Scripture
- Wooden altar and cross in the front foyer, which is clearly visible and reflects the Liturgical Seasons of the Year.
- Inspirational Signage in Stairwells

Our call to discipleship and service are evident throughout St. Raymond School. Each classroom has a clearly identifiable Sacred Space in a prominent place which can serve as a focus for classroom prayer and reflection. The season of the liturgical year are represented in these sacred spaces.

As visitors are welcomed to St. Raymond School, the Catholic identity of our community is evident upon entry through the altar and sacred space present in the foyer of the building. As well, St. Raymond School Chapel is a sacred space where students and staff can regularly gather for the purposes of liturgies, reflections, restorative mediations, and prayer.

Staff and students answer the call to service in many ways as well, including the collection of donations of food, money, clothing, and personal needs items, for various campaigns throughout the year. These include the Thanksgiving and Christmas Food Drive, Dr. Simone Food and Materials Collections, Angel Tree, ShareLife initiatives.

These visible reminders and opportunities to serve help us focus our learning and interactions on the key tenets of our shared faith, and to ensure that our Catholic Faith is lived out daily at St. Raymond School.
